GEOCACHE ENGLAND

16-22 May, 2026

Join an enthusiastic group of geocachers as we cache around England.

This seven-day geocaching experience will take you caching along the banks of the Thames, at Stonehenge, the famous Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site in Dorset, along the coast of Devon, and to the southernmost point on mainland UK on the Lizard Peninsula in Cornwall. We return through the historic town of Bath - visiting the roman structures and more.

We will learn about the landscapes of England as we go (and yes...we will visit EarthCaches and learn about how the amazing geology and formed the terrains). We will see ruined castles and stately manor homes. We will see pretty seaside villages (and maybe eat in a few local pubs). And (tides permitting), we will get a chance to collect some awesome fossils.

Whilst on the Jurassic Coast, we will explore a series of stunning geological sites that span 185 million years. We will attempt to do some cache runs along the coast (and make sure we have time for good fish and chips, or maybe a sausage roll).

Our journey then continues further westwards into Cornwall - our main destination is the Lizard Peninsula. This is a stunning location with wonderful sea views.

From the Lizard Peninsula, our route turns eastwards along the north coast of Cornwall to visit some of the isolated ruins of the tin mining industry, an area whose importance in the Industrial Revolution is recognized in its World Heritage Site status.

TRIP PLAN *

Day 1 - Saturday May 16

Pick up group at a hotel near Heathrow
Cache along the banks of the Thames river
Cache and visit Stonehenge.



Day 2 - Sunday May 17

Visit Corf Castle and do the EarthCaches and traditional in that village. Cache around Swanage. See dinosaur footprints and more.

Day 3 - Monday May 18

Cache along the Jurassic Coast
Visit Lulworth Cove (two EarthCaches)
Visit Durdle Door (Earthcache)
Visit Portland and log caches on the Island (and on on Chisel Beach)

Day 4 - Tuesday May 18

Collect some fossils and cache near Lyme Regis
See where Mary Anning made the famous tongue twister about selling sea shells.

Day 5 - Wednesday May 20

Drive to Lizard
Cache on the southern most point of England.

Day 6 - Thursday May 21

Drive through Cornwall, visit and cache around some old tin mines. End up near Bath

Day 7 - Friday May 22

Visit and cache around Bath - Roman baths and amazing city!
Dropoff at hotel near Heathrow

Some additional details...

Accommodation

We will be staying in a delightful English hotels as we travel around England. We have tried to book places with character when we could. We will share rooms as we go - two people per room. Partners, spouses, friends will be placed together etc. Some isolated locations may mean we have to share bathrooms.

Transportation

We will use 9 seater air-conditioned vans to travel around England. There is plenty of room which provides everyone with a great opportunity to take photos as well as spend time with fellow participants between stops.

Gary Lewis (Geoaware) created EarthCaching and was the original reviewer for the entire world. He developed the program including the EarthCache Masters scheme. He has 'retired' from the program in 2015. He is now the President of GEOetc. His speciality is the communication of geological processes to teachers, students and the general public and the operation of programs that raise the awareness of Earth science at an international level. He is a trained geologist - with an honors degree in Geology from the University of Sydney - and a K-12 teacher. He has worked in Earth science outreach in Australia and the USA and run trips for teachers to Hawaii, Iceland, Australia and other destinations since the 1980s. He is the author of over 100 Earth science teaching resources..
